Lesson: Bison Facts Grade Level: 4

Standard:

Culture- 4.6.2 Explain the contributions of various ethnic groups (e.g., Native Americans, immigrants) to the history of North Dakota (e.g., food, traditions, languages, celebrations).

Language Arts- W.2.a Introduce a topic or text clearly, state an opinion, and create an organizational structure in which related ideas are grouped to support the writer's purpose.

Objective: 4th grade students will explore the bison's role in culture, habitat, and modern-day North Dakota by creating a poster with fellow classmates and through further reading in booklets and will be able to describe these facts to the instructor. Students understand the importance of culture, individual identity, and group identity.

Materials:

- Poster paper
- Markers/ Crayons
- Bison cut outs
- Print paper (white)
- Bison booklet
- Pencils

Anticipatory Set/ Hook: The students will be given a cutout of a bison and a blank sheet of paper. From their knowledge of bison, they will be asked to draw where they think the bison lives in its natural habitat. They will need to produce a color drawing, which is creative as well as realistic. Once the drawing is complete, students will place the bison somewhere on their drawing.

Activity/Procedures: Students will get a chance to interact with one another and share what they have created for the bison's habitat. They will also be able to share with the person next to them why they chose certain items to be in their drawings.


Students will be put into groups of 4 to 5 and there will be 4 groups. Each group will be asked to research/ look up the answers to a set of questions, which will be provided to each group (see page 3).

After all these questions have been answered and reviewed by the instructor, each group will be provided a poster paper and asked to draw a picture of their own bison, nice and big on the center of the poster paper. This will need to be in color (color of choice). Next, in marker students write down what they have researched/ looked up about bison and write the facts out on the poster paper. It will need to be written nice and big somewhere on the poster paper. Make sure students use lots of colors and neatness is encouraged. The posters will be displayed around the room.

Follow Up/Closure: Students will be given a bison booklet. The booklet will be blank and the students will be asked to fill out 3 pages of the booklet with their favorite facts and/or the ones they had found most interesting from their research. Some students will be asked to share what they have written in their booklets and when assignment is complete they will be able to take the booklets home.

Assessment: Students will be put back into their groups they had for creating posters. The instructor will ask a question pertaining to bison facts. Every group will be given a white board (or a sheet of paper) and one student from that group will answer the question. The students will take turns answering the questions and whoever can come up with the answer the fastest will gain 2 points for their team, while everyone else will gain 1 point.

Additional Differentiated Activities: If there was a child with autism in the class the background will already be drawn and colored for them (or a print out of a background). They will be given a bison cut out and will be able to place it anywhere they want on the drawing.
